## **Updates from class -**

**Year 6** – In Year 6, we have immersed ourselves in a range of exciting and thought-provoking topics this term. In English, we have been exploring the horror genre and are currently writing alternative suspense stories inspired by the short film *Alma*.

The children have enjoyed experimenting with atmosphere, tension, and plot twists to keep their readers on edge! In geography, we have been asking big questions about global equality. Through investigating the sustainability of the cocoa farming industry, pupils have developed their enquiry skills and deepened their understanding of how fair trade and ethical consumer choices can help make the world a more equal place.

Meanwhile, in history, we've travelled back in time to Ancient Athens. By analysing both primary and secondary sources, we have been using our enquiry and inference skills to uncover fascinating insights into Athenian culture, democracy, and daily life.

**Year 5** — Our Year 5 pupils enjoyed a pleasant Spring Term 2, marked by predominantly sunny conditions. Within the mathematics curriculum, they addressed a variety of topics, encompassing decimals, percentages, and fractions. Subsequently, the pupils engaged with the study of statistics, during which they plotted data on graphical representations. This undertaking proved beneficial in establishing cross-curricular connections with geography, where the children interpreted climate graphs, and in science, where their skills were further developed through the creation of line graphs based on their investigative findings.

The Year 5 teachers were particularly impressed by the children's dedication to their 'World Book Day' costumes and the considerate assistance many pupils offered to their peers in preparing their costumes! This occasion was a source of considerable pleasure and fostered a greater enthusiasm for reading. Aligning with the Year 5 curriculum and building upon the children's acquired knowledge of Islam, a visit to a mosque is scheduled for the upcoming week to enhance their comprehension of religions and places of worship.

The term concluded with considerable enthusiasm following a special visit from MC Grammar. The children participated in an energetic morning of dancing and confidently performed their 'antonym' song; moreover, MC Grammar himself acknowledged their commendable choreography.

## **Updates from class-**

**Year 4** – Our Year 4 pupils engaged in a practical geographical study, undertaking a site investigation of the areas where there are floods and collaboratively devising strategies to enhance the school's flood resilience. Within religious education, the curriculum focused on the significance of Easter, exploring various traditions such as the consumption of hot cross buns and the symbolic representation of new life through eggs.

In history, the children have been studying the process by which various countries gained independence and the relevance of timelines. Furthermore, within the historical context of nations gaining independence, pupils have also begun to explore the significant historical event of the Windrush migration and its enduring relevance to the United Kingdom.

To conclude the term, all pupils were treated to a special performance by MC Grammar, an event that was met with considerable enthusiasm and appreciation across the whole school.

**Year 3** —the Year 3 children again continued to develop their multiplication and related division skills using partitioning, while in literacy, they have been exploring biographies and have been developing their own biographies focusing on the life of Rosa Parks. In reading lessons, we have been reading and discussing The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe.

In RE, they have learned about Hinduism by discussing the similarities and differences to other faiths, while in science, they have explored forces and magnetism, including contact and non-contact forces. In PSHE, they have continued to learn about health and well-being, as well as some basic First Aid.

In geography, they have begun to explore the similarities and differences between England and Greece, and begun to explore the human and natural features of each country. In history, they have continued to learn about the Stone Age and the social and technological transition into the Bronze Age and Iron Age.

## **Updates from class-**

**Year 2** – As we wrap up the Spring 2 term, we're excited to share the fantastic learning Year 2 has experienced. The children have been busy and creative this term, especially with the sunny weather! In English, they've innovated their own versions of *Jack and the Beanstalk*, enhancing their storytelling and writing skills. In maths, we've focused on multiplication, with the children mastering the 2, 5, and 10 times tables.

Geography has taken them to central London, where they've explored the importance of green spaces. In history, the children learned about the *Great Fire of London*, discovering its impact on fire safety and city planning.

In computing, Year 2 had fun creating stop-motion animations on iPads, and they're excited to share their projects soon.

It's been a busy, fun-filled term, and we're looking forward to continuing their progress in the final term of the year!

**Year 1** – Year 1 has kicked off Spring Term 2 with enthusiasm and creativity! In literacy, the children had the exciting opportunity to write their own innovative stories based on Handa's Surprise, crafting their own unique narratives.

In maths, we've expanded our learning to focus on place value up to 50, and students are now exploring the practical aspects of capacity and mass through hands-on activities. The children have also been introduced to the five vertebrate groups in science, deepening their understanding of the animal kingdom.

A highlight of the term was Alien Day, a fun and memorable experience for both our pupils and parents. The day was filled with energy as students and parents came together to explore phonics. This was a fantastic opportunity for parents to see how we conduct phonics lessons and prepare for the phonics screening checks.

We also had the pleasure of meeting MC Grammar, who inspired our students to further ignite their passion in literacy!

We can't wait to welcome our pupils back for the summer term, filled with more learning adventures.

## **Updates from class-**

**Reception** – We have had a busy half term learning about animals. We have looked at different texts and how to differentiate between fiction and non-fiction. We also embedded this learning into our trip to Dagenham Heathway Library. We travelled on the public bus to our local town and enjoyed reading a selection of books.

In literacy we have been developing our vocabulary by using and understanding new words such as, vast, fact, fiction, non-fiction, thick, wading and flappy. We are also developing our ability to write simple sentences using our phonic knowledge to spell words to develop our transcription skills. In maths we have continued to develop our number knowledge of the composition of numbers to 7. We can talk about the two amounts that make a given total to all numbers to 7, for example 5 and 2 make 7 and 4 and 3 make 7.

In science we have been learning about the season of spring and how some animals lay eggs to produce their young. We looked at different animal eggs and their features and are able to name the young animals that hatch.

In geography we have been learning about how rivers join seas and oceans and we took a lovely walk to our local Beam River. We know how the river has banks to protect the area from flooding.

In PE we have been learning dance using the story, Going On A Bear Hunt. We can travel by going over, under, around and through using different movements.

In RE we have been learning about the customs of Ramadan and Easter and how different communities celebrate these events.

**Nursery** – This term has been filled with creativity, exploration, and fun learning. Here's a glimpse into what the children have been up to:

## **Transport Topic**

The children had a blast exploring transport, making a train out of boxes, and enjoying stories like *The Journey Home From Grandpa's* and *We're Going On A Bear Hunt*. They also created vehicles from recycled materials and learned about the evolution of transport.

### Maths Fun

In maths, we've been learning to subitise to 3 and exploring patterns with shapes and colours. The children have made great progress and loved these activities!

Our garden adventures have been a highlight, from watching caterpillars grow to exploring minibeasts and noticing the changes in nature as we welcome Spring.

### **Developing Skills**

We've been using art to express emotions, and it's been wonderful to see the children's creativity grow.

Through visible consistency, we are restorative in our approach, using a range of methods and strategies to maintain positive relationships. Our three simplified core rules: Ready, Respectful, Safe, ensure that we are consistent in our approach.

We aim to provide an inclusive, calm, quiet atmosphere in the school and encourage children to move around responsibly. Our expectations of the children can only be realised through the cooperation and support between home and school. Should any difficulties be encountered, we invite parents to work with us to resolve them. Positive behaviour is a collective responsibility within the school. This extends beyond the individual classroom to cover every child and every area of the school and playground.

If you have any concerns about a pupil, we ask that you follow the correct procedures by notifying the school through our concern form <a href="https://forms.office.com/e/aHNLnBTVgM">https://forms.office.com/e/aHNLnBTVgM</a>, rather than approaching other children or their families directly. We often have important context regarding a family or child, and we are best placed to handle these concerns with sensitivity and understanding. This approach helps to maintain a positive atmosphere for all.
