As we come to the end of the Autumn Term, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support and partnership with the school.



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Updates from class -

Year 6 – Year 6 have recently taken part in their forensic day workshop, where they solved a case using a range of scientific methods such as finger print analysis and forensic composite drawing. Following this, the second part of the workshop involved the children immersing themselves in a mock court case, in which they took up the roles of suspects, lawyers, jury and even a judge. This learning has aided the children's understanding for their history topic of how crime and punishment has changed over a period of time.

Pupils have also used this knowledge to write a newspaper report regarding the recent release of a wrongfully convicted man, the dramatic ending to their study of novel 'The Faraway Truth' in literacy. Elsewhere, the children have started learning about evolution in science and looking at different religious views regarding life after death.

Year 5 – The children have enjoyed a busy and rewarding autumn term, taking part in a wide range of positive learning experiences across the curriculum. Through hands-on activities and thoughtful discussions, they have risen to challenges and demonstrated determination in everything they have undertaken.

The term concluded on a joyful and festive high with the pupils' fantastic production of The Sound of the Underground. Performing with confidence, enthusiasm, and excellent teamwork, they thoroughly entertained the audience and had everyone singing along. It has been a happy and fulfilling term, filled with smiles and special memories.

We wish all our pupils a safe, restful, and joyful Christmas break.




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Updates from class-

Year 4 – This has been a very busy half term with children continuing to develop their mathematical skills especially in multiplication and division. Whilst in literacy, they used the stimulus of 'The Iron Man' text to create their own adventure.

In science, the children explored electricity, constructing simple circuits using cells, wires, bulbs, switches, and buzzers. They investigate which materials conduct electricity and learn to draw and interpret circuit diagrams.

As part of our history topic, Life in Dagenham Village, we visited Valence House Museum where children were able to learn about how Dagenham has changed throughout the years. They particularly enjoyed creating a timeline through the ages.



Year 3 – This term in Year 3, we have been busy learning and having fun! In PE, we have been practicing our football skills, including dribbling, passing, and working as a team. Everyone has shown great effort and improvement.

We also prepared for our School Christmas Production. The children learnt their lines, sang songs, and helped with costumes and props. They thoroughly enjoyed performing and did a fantastic job sharing their hard work with families. Thank you for your continued support at home.

Year 2 – This term, our Year 2 children have been busy deepening their learning across the curriculum. In maths, they explored a range of efficient strategies for addition and subtraction, developing flexibility and confidence in their number work.

In literacy, the children produced wonderful retells of a story inspired by *Zog*, showcasing their creativity and growing writing skills. Science lessons saw them investigating different materials through hands-on experiments, while in geography they learned about a variety of climates and how animals and humans adapt to living in different environments.

We are incredibly proud of the children for their excellent Christmas production, where they truly demonstrated our school values of striving and community



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Updates from class-

Year 1 - As we near the end of the second half of the autumn term, Year 1 have been very busy across the curriculum. In science, we explored different materials, using our senses to describe their properties and learning whether they are natural or manufactured. In history, we compared Victorian schools with our modern classrooms, focusing on the experiences of boys, girls, rich and poor.

In geography, we learned about our school by drawing route maps, identifying human and physical features, and acting as tour guides for Year 6. In RE, we explored Christianity and the importance of belonging, including a visit to Dagenham Parish Church to learn about christenings.

In PE, we developed throwing, catching and teamwork skills through dodgeball. In literacy, we built confidence using phonics for reading and writing, explored *The Three Billy Goats Gruff*, and wrote instructions to make chocolate Rudolph cakes. In maths, we focused on addition and subtraction within 10 using part-whole models.

To end the autumn term, Year 1 sang and danced their hearts out to wish everyone a Merry Christmas!



Reception – This half term in Reception, the children have greatly enjoyed learning about and exploring a range of religious and cultural celebrations, including Diwali, Hanukkah, Christmas and birthdays. They have shown wonderful curiosity as they discovered the different ways people celebrate. The children have settled well into Reception and are thriving within their space, with their enthusiasm for new learning evident each day. Thank you for your ongoing support at home.




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Updates from class-

Nursery – What a wonderful and busy half term we have had in Nursery! The children have shown great curiosity, confidence and independence, and we are so proud of all they have achieved. Here are some highlights from this term:

Creative Learning - The children enjoyed exploring a range of materials, including dough, puffy paint, clay and playdough. They learnt to roll and cut dough to make Christmas biscuits and experimented with different textures. Many also enjoyed mark making, with some beginning to practise writing their names.

Understanding the World - We celebrated Culture Day, learning about the different cultures in our Nursery, and explored a range of celebrations including Bonfire Night, Diwali and the Christmas story.


Early Maths - In maths, the children focused on numbers 1–3 and explored how shapes fit into spaces, developing early problem-solving skills through hands-on activities.

Phonics and Early Literacy - Phonics sessions have been full of enthusiasm, with children blending sounds, joining in with songs and listening for rhyming words in stories and poems.

Growing Independence - We have seen fantastic progress in independence, with most children confidently using the toilet and working together to tidy up.

Special Moments - A highlight of the term was practising and performing our Christmas show. The children loved learning the songs and actions and did a wonderful job performing.

Christmas Production – Our Christmas performances were a huge success across the school.

Year 1–6 delighted audiences with *A No. 1 Christmas*, performing a range of Christmas number one hits from through the years.

Reception presented a cosy and joyful Christmas performance, singing well-known festive songs, and even getting parents up dancing alongside the children!

Nursery proudly performed their Nativity play for parents, showcasing their confidence and enthusiasm on stage.


Well done to all of our children for their fantastic performances and thank you to families for your continued support.

A special mention must also go to the boys who were not selected for this match but continued to attend training every week. Their commitment and high standards have played a huge part in raising the overall level of the group, directly contributing to the team's strong performance.




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Parent Support Advisors

Should you have any pre-loved school uniform that you wish to donate, please continue to send in to our school office.




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Ready, Respectful, Safe

Our three simplified core rules: Ready, Respectful, Safe, ensure that we are consistent in our approach.

We aim to provide an inclusive, calm, quiet atmosphere in the school and encourage children to move around responsibly. Our expectations of the children can only be realised through the cooperation and support between home and school. Should any difficulties be encountered, we invite parents to work with us to resolve them. Positive behaviour is a collective responsibility within the school. This extends beyond the individual classroom to cover every child and every area of the school and playground.

Attendance

Medical appointments

Parents will be expected to make medical or dental appointments outside of school hours wherever possible. Where this is not possible, a copy of the appointment letter or text must be shown to the school office. Parents will be expected to obtain approval for their child's absence to attend such appointments as far in advance as is practicable. Parents will be responsible for ensuring their child misses only the amount of time necessary to attend the appointment.

Punctuality


School starts at 8:30 and gates shut at 8:40 prompt. Arriving late disrupts the class and children's learning.


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
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Special Christmas Visitor

The children have had great fun searching for Elvis each day and discovering what he has been up to, adding extra excitement and Christmas cheer to the school.





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
