School Updates

Year 6 – We would like to start by congratulating all of our Year 6 pupils on their recent SATs results. The children worked incredibly hard in preparing for their exams and should be very proud of their accomplishments. However, learning does not stop and pupils have continued to strive across a range of subjects. One memorable learning experience in particular includes the heart dissection that the children carried out where pupils learnt about the anatomy of the heart and how it functions in pumping blood around the body.

Throughout this half-term, pupils have also enjoyed a number of trips including a journey to Fried Frank law firm for Work Week; the Romford TA Centre for the borough's Junior Citizen award; and most recently a day out at Adventure Island to celebrate their time at Beam County Primary School.

Year 5 – This summer term has been vibrant and enriching for our Year 5 pupils. They kicked off with a visit to Linklaters, a top London law firm, where they confidently pitched ethical product ideas, impressing the panel with their creativity and professionalism.

Back at school, pupils brought energy and team spirit to Sports Day. They also got a taste of secondary school life with visits to All Saints Catholic School, Brooks Academy and Sixth Form, taking part in exciting lessons such as engineering, food technology, and media—broadening their understanding of future opportunities.

The Year 5 girls enjoyed a dedicated activity day filled with dance, martial arts, and box-jamming, boosting their confidence and well-being. Finally, pupils were thrilled to attend a performance of *Aladdin* at Dagenham Park Secondary School, where they showed exemplary behaviour and enthusiasm.

Updates from class -

Year 4 — This final summer term has been a vibrant and busy one for Year 4, filled with rich cross-curricular learning. In history and literacy, we delved into the story of the Windrush generation, exploring their experiences and the lasting contributions they have made to British life today. The children showed great empathy and curiosity as they deepened their understanding through discussion and creative tasks.

In science, we've been hands-on with exciting experiments, investigating how sound travels and how the digestive system works—sparking plenty of awe and wonder in the classroom! As part of World of Work Week, we had the fantastic opportunity to visit the Queen's Theatre. The behind-the-scenes tour gave us a glimpse into the world of theatre production, and the children channelled their creativity into designing and building their own mini theatre projects.

We also want to celebrate the dedication Year 4 has shown in practising their times tables in preparation for the Multiplication Tables Check. Their hard work truly paid off—well done to each and every one of you!

We are incredibly proud of your enthusiasm, creativity, and commitment this term.

Year 3 — During Summer 2, the Year 3 children continued to develop their understanding of measuring length, mass and capacity using the metric system, understanding what fractions are and how they can be used, as well as reinforcing the importance of knowing and applying their multiplication knowledge and use of number lines. They also developed their understanding of geometric shapes and properties. In literacy, the pupils enjoyed learning how to develop and innovate a poem using rhythm and the use of stanzas and couplets, rhyming words, alliteration, similes and onomatopoeia.

In RE, the children have begun to further develop their understanding of religious symbols as they applied this to Sikhism. For science, we have explored plant life and the mechanisms that help plants to grow, survive and reproduce. In history, the pupils have explored important aspects of the Ancient Egyptians society, including how the pyramids were built, what was found inside the pyramids or tombs, the mummification process and the Egyptian beliefs regarding the afterlife. For geography, the pupils have learned about the natural resources and how they are used, found, mined and the consequences of their usage.

Updates from class-

Year 2 – It's been a busy and exciting summer term in Year 2! We've explored shapes, halves, and quarters in maths and completed our imaginative potion recipes to cure grumpy grandmas—based on *George's Marvellous Medicine*. The children loved imagining the wild effects George's potion might have on farm animals, from three-eyed cows to flying chickens!

In history, we learned about the inspiring contributions of Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale. We also concluded our geography topic on Pakistan. Sports Day was a fantastic success, and class parties were a definite highlight!

Year 1 – For our final half-term, the Year 1 children have engaged in a variety of enriching learning experiences. In literacy, we have delved into fantasy worlds with the pupils writing beautiful stories of their own. In maths, we have started learning about money which the children have found very interesting.

In the foundation subjects, the Year 1 pupils have dived into seaside holidays in the Victorian times, comparing breaks away, then and now. In RE, we have been learning about the Muslim religion, with many of our pupils being able to share their own experiences and knowledge.

Our pupils have shown their love of learning, having matured and developed in so many ways during the course of the year. We are very proud of each and every one of them, and know that they will continue to thrive in Year 2. To parents and carers, thank you for your continued support this year. As we approach the summer break, we hope that it is a refreshing time for you all.

Updates from class-

Reception - This half-term, Reception blasted off on an amazing adventure with our topic "Who Can Save the World?" From the very start, the children were buzzing with excitement as we explored some truly inspiring books like A Superhero Like You, A Superpower Like Mine and Superkid. These stories sparked big imaginations and even bigger ideas!

The children let their creativity fly as they designed and labelled their very own superheroes, each one unique, powerful, and ready to save the day! They tackled tricky inferential questions, and then created their own story maps—swapping out the evil character with their brand-new ones!

During Work Week, we dived into the world of transport and jobs, discovering all the amazing people who help our communities run smoothly. A highlight was the Marlborough Highways Workshop, where we had a blast learning about road safety, different type of traffic lights, and how to stay safe while out and about.

In maths, we got hands-on with rekenreks, making number magic as we explored subitising, number bonds to 5 and 10, and spotting clever number patterns. The children showed super skills and super focus.

Nursery – As the year ends, we've been busy learning, playing, and getting ready for the exciting move to Reception.

A big highlight was our very first Sports Day—the children showed amazing enthusiasm and teamwork. We were so proud of their confidence and smiles!

In our learning, we explored pushing and pulling through hands-on activities, became data collectors by charting our favourite fruits, and got creative with repeating patterns using shapes, colours, and movement.

There was also plenty of water play, where we worked together to transport water and solve problems—lots of splashing fun and teamwork!

We're so proud of how far the children have come. They're more than ready for Reception, although we'll miss their bright smiles and boundless curiosity.


