At Beam, we are incredibly fortunate to employ a private Speech and Language Therapist who works with us one day per week. If you feel that your child might benefit from an assessment of their speech and language skills, then please discuss this with your child's teacher. One of the very best things that you can do to promote speech and language development with your child is reading together and talking about stories and words. Try making shared story time a part of your regular routine - even if your children are older!
